## From the Pastor



Dear Wausau First Family of Faith,

Ever since the unanimous vote to move forward with the arrangement with the Community Foundation (CF) and the Hmong American Center (HAC), leaders from our church, the CF, and HAC have been regularly meeting to plan many details in this transition. Many thanks to Ray Nowaczyk, Dick Rayborn, and Bill Owen for their dedication, wisdom, and leadership! These three will also be coming alongside the Trustees Committee for the next year as we navigate the new paths and opportunities this arrangement will bring.

You may start to notice some of the church-related art will be moved out of the Parlor and Fellowship Hall. The Aesthetics team will be deciding where they can be moved to in our exclusive spaces. Some artwork may be stored safely until they can be moved into soon-to-be remodeled areas. There are some pieces that may not work with our new or existing spaces, and those will be available for a donation for anyone interested.

We encountered a potential challenge that turned into a better solution. We were told that the board of the Community Foundation is now hesitant to become property managers, and since the Hmong American Center is big enough to be the only other organization to share space with us, they thought we should give the lease directly to HAC. The leaders from our church and I were uncomfortable with this, since it is considerably different from what we voted for. Ray Nowaczyk is credited for proposing a winning solution to this challenge: we will work with HAC and the CF to create a new non-profit organization to become the new "Agent" that our church will lease our building to as outlined. The new non-profit Board will function as the Advisory Board as outlined in the lease we voted on, with two representatives from our church, two from the CF, two from HAC, and an at-large community member. The CF will still oversee raising and managing the funds and set-up of this new non-profit, but the new non-profit will be responsible for the operations of the building. Ray, Dick, Bill, and I all feel that this maintains the spirit of our vote, and we hope that the rest of the congregation and Conference does as well.

## **Trip to Mission Guatemala**

We have been invited to join Onalaska UMC on a trip to Mission Guatemala in San Andres Semetabaj.

We have been supporting this ministry through our missions offerings and have taken two trips there in previous years. This is an opportunity to renew our relationship with this health and education ministry to this Mayan community in rural Guatemala.

The group size is a maximum of 20 participants and it looks like Onalaska will be sending 10 people, leaving about 10 slots for our congregation. The dates in Guatemala would be August 3-10 (8 days and 7 nights) plus travel time. The program cost is \$675, which covers all expenses while in Guatemala. Travel expenses will be \$540-\$800, depending on what arrangements can be made. A valid passport is required and a COVID-19 vaccine is strongly recommended by Mission Guatemala staff.

While we are there we will be working with local contractors on a construction project serving the community. We will also be learning about the local Mayan culture and the vital services provided by Mission Guatemala. There will also be opportunities to visit the nearby tourist town of Panajachel and enjoy the spectacular scenery!

This trip is open to anyone over 16 and youth are especially invited. We will be having fundraising opportunities to help cover the costs. ## Ministering to Many through the Personal Needs and Claire's Critter Closets

The Personal Needs and Claire's Critter Closets are a growing and much-needed mission of our church to our community. We are very thankful to all of those who have volunteered in 2023, including Mike and Liz Fischer who lead the PNC. Other faithful volunteers include the Duginski's, Marquardt's, Gail Cain, Jan Clowes, Bonnie Goertz, Karen Peterson, Georgia Reynolds, Andy White, and many others. We are also grateful to Linda Sagsetter and her family, who have been hard-working coordinator and volunteers for CCC, but she (and they) are stepping down due to health issues. Please consider whether God is calling you to help with CCC and let Pastor Rebecca know if you have any questions.

Both closets are open on the 2nd Tuesdays from 1-3pm and 4th Saturdays from 9-11am. Each household can come up to six times a year, but most families only come 3-4 times/year. This year, there have been an average of 44 households being helped each day. 71% of households are assisted through both the PNC and CCC. We have helped about 300 different households with about 800 individuals this year with much needed and appreciated support.

These missions are also a ministry. Our volunteers listen compassionately to the challenges faced by the people who come and pray with people who ask. We also give Bible devotional books to those who ask to bring them words of hope. Please consider getting involved by volunteering, donating funds, and praying for these meaningful ministries. 
