"There are the less dangerous foes of congregational singing, the 'unmusical," who cannot sing, of whom there are far fewer than we are led to believe."

This group will be working with local contractors on a construction project serving the local communities. They will also get the opportunity to learn about the local Mayan culture and the vital services provided by Mission Guatemala. We know this group will represent our church well and are eager to hear of their experiences and insights when they return! Join us for service on August 18 to welcome them back and hear some of their stories.

Congolese **Mustard Seed** Worship Service Grant Approved!

FUMC has started offering worship services for the many Congolese refugees who have relocated to the Wausau area, with more expected to join them. These services will be held on Sundays at 10:30am in our Chapel during the summer, and 11:30am during the school year.

Jean-Claude Tambwe, previously a Bishop in Zimbabwe, and his family, who are recent refugees, have generously offered to lead these services. Worship is provided in both Swahili and French languages.

All are welcome to join and experience worship with our Congolese neighbors.

We have been graciously awarded a Mustard Seed Migration Grant of \$2,000 to continue our church's support of the refugees in the Wausau area.

The Mustard Seed Migration Grant program is designed to encourage United Methodist churches to engage in ministry to migrants in their midst. UMCOR awards these grants to up to 100 United Methodist churches in the U.S. to engage in new, one-time community-based service projects and ministries focused on migrants and refugees.

In our application we asked for and were awarded funds for the following:

- Rental Assistance-\$1,200
- Water Bills-\$300
- Electric/Gas Bills-\$500

This will allow us to assist local refugee families when they are struggling to pay their basic home bills as they transition.

Other Grants...

Mike and Liz Fischer applied for an Impact100 grant of up to \$10,000 for the Personal Needs Closet. We were informed this grant has been postponed for some changes but our application was accepted for consideration. We will stay hopeful and keep you updated!
