Dear First Wausau Family and Friends,

As we enter this season of gratitude, I want to express my gratefulness for you. As a congregation, you have shown generosity, unity, and patience in many ways. For two years, you prayerfully waited as the YMCA, then the Hmong American Center (HAC), each seemed eager to share our space over the long term. Due to the imminent need to replace the roof, we gave HAC a deadline of October 1 to decide whether or not they would accept our \$1/year offer. In exchange for that, they would have accepted the financial responsibility of major updates like replacing the roof. They ended up not accepting that offer, and we decided to change our approach. Now, we are managing the financial costs ourselves for capital improvements, such as the roof. We are also making a concerted effort to find missionally compatible long-term renters for unused spaces to offset these extra expenses.

As we approach Thanksgiving, I encourage each of you to reflect on the blessings in your life—family, friends, and the gift of faith – as we also navigate the changes and challenges we face as individuals and as church. Will we continue to build relationships, both new and old? Will we commit to preparing for a healthy and sustainable future? Will we have honest and healing conversations with each other and God? The answers to these questions begin with prayer. Let us keep praying our Breakthrough Prayer, at 9:03 am and/or pm, every day!

Thank you God, for the sacred moments and places you give us to gather, grow, and serve together. By Your Spirit, renew our ministry and break through whatever is holding back your will. Lord, provide all that is needed to move forward in this space with renewed purpose. Amen!

Using A.I. Tools in the Church and Hybrid Hospitality

First United Methodist Church in Madison, along with the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation and First Foundation, invite you to a workshop on how to use A.I. Tools in the Church.

In this day long training, Jason will walk you through what A.I. is, why we should be using it in the church (with theological underpinnings to back it up), and how to use it (and how not to use it), and even where the ethical lines are that we should not be crossing.

During the day, Jason will expose you to the tools, help you know which are best for which scenario, talk about copyright, ethics, and do several real-time demos. We'll also cover 10 distinct ways to use A.I. in ministry.

If you'd like a broad primer on A.I. to see how it could benefit your ministry, this is for you. And don't worry, it's not highly technical. You also won't have to go broke with A.I. because many of the tools are free or inexpensive. Bring your computer and follow along, or just sit back, watch, and observe.

Jason has been a long time proponent for the use of technology in the church. For decades he's been leading trainings on the use of media, screens, visuals, and more. And now he's helping the church embrace Artificial Intelligence in ministry.



Roof Repair Campaign

Most of the church roofing is overdue for replacement so the trustees and finance committees have decided to move forward on the repairs, which will be a significant cost to the church.

The roof repairs, to start in Spring 2025, will cost at least \$305,000. A 10-year loan will cost more than \$405,000 including interest, with monthly payments of about \$3,400. The down payment of \$105,000 is required by November 1st. We are asking for your help to meet this financial obligation for the church. The more money we can provide upfront the less interest we will incur. Assistance will be needed to meet our monthly payment once the loan is taken.

You can make special donations for this expense by memoing your check or cash envelope, or donating online (facilities project fund). Pledges can also be made for this campaign on the 2025 pledge cards or online.
