# From the Pastor

God's Grace and Peace to All!

At our church's annual meeting in November, our Bishop announced the focus of 2025 will be a "Year of Grace." United Methodists see God's grace as the foundation of faith and life. We will be exploring the nuances of grace, such as prevenient, convicting, justifying, sanctifying, and glorifying grace. John Wesley also spoke of the importance of responsible grace.

One example is God's grace in response to our prayers and efforts to be better stewards of our space. Three non-profits are coming to share our building between the end of January and the beginning of March. New Beginnings for Refugees will use the rooms in the upstairs N/S hallway to teach English to adults, provide childcare for their young children while they learn, and provide personal needs and household goods to refugees. Their main entrance will be from the courtyard by the Chapel. Mosaic (which emerged from the YWCA) and Wausau Childcare will have administrative offices upstairs along the E/W hallway, and both will use the Worship Entrance from the parking lot. We will continue to have Sunday School upstairs, with children in the largest room with the mural and youth in the large room with a divider (to be shared with Mosaic during office hours). We will likely move the youth game tables into the Theater Room so Wausau Childcare can use the two narrow classrooms overlooking the parking lot for their offices. Our upstairs will be fully and well-used!

We will keep you informed and involved as things progress. Please keep praying for God's grace to fill our space so we can be responsible stewards and faithful witnesses in our mission and ministry. Most importantly, always look and thank God for signs of grace.

New Year, New Opportunities:
Practicing Faithful Stewardship in 2025
January 2025

As we turn the page on the calendar and step into a new year, January offers us a wonderful opportunity to reflect, reset, and recommit ourselves to living as faithful stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. Stewardship is about more than finances—it encompasses every aspect of our lives: our time, talents, treasures, and the care we show for God's creation.

### The Biblical Basis for Stewardship

Scripture reminds us that everything we have belongs to God. Genesis 2:15 shows us that even from the beginning, humanity was called to care for creation: "The Lord God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work it and take care of it." Similarly, 1 Peter 4:10 encourages us to use our gifts to serve others: "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." This year, let us take these words to heart and seek to be intentional in how we manage the resources, relationships, and responsibilities entrusted to us.

### Personal Goal-Setting for Stewardship

The start of a new year is a natural time to set goals. Consider these questions as you prayerfully plan your year:

- <u>Time</u>: How can you dedicate more time to prayer, worship, and service this year? Can you set aside a regular time for volunteering or participating in church activities?
- <u>Talents</u>: What gifts and skills has God given you?
   Are there ways you can use them to bless your church, your community, or those in need?
- <u>Treasures</u>: Reflect on your financial stewardship. Is this the year to begin tithing, increase your giving, or support a specific ministry or mission project?

Financial Stewardship and Budgeting January is also an ideal time to review your budget and ensure it aligns with your values. Here are a few tips for financial stewardship:

- 1. Create a Giving Plan: Start by determining what percentage of your income you can give back to God's work. Even small, consistent contributions can make a big impact over time.
- 2. Build an Emergency Fund: Responsible stewardship includes planning for unexpected expenses.
- 3. Reduce Debt: If you're carrying debt, consider making a plan to reduce it this year. Financial freedom allows for more generous giving.

### Renew Focus on Vision and Goals

As the new year begins, remind the congregation of the church's mission and vision for the year ahead and how they can be a part of it. Include a Discipleship Moment in your worship service and/or newsletter.

When we talk about stewardship in the church, we often focus solely on giving. Take time to emphasize other areas of stewardship as well. This includes financial stewardship (earning, spending, saving, getting out of debt, etc.) and areas such as environmental stewardship.

### Stewardship is a Key Part of Our Discipleship

Faithful stewardship is a spiritual practice. It's not just a tactical effort but one that should be nurtured through other spiritual disciplines, like prayer.



## **Roof Repair Campaign**

In August, we were graciously awarded a Mustard Seed Migration Grant of \$2,000 to continue our church's support of the refugees in the Wausau area.

The Mustard Seed Migration Grant program is designed to encourage United Methodist churches to engage in ministry to migrants in their midst.

In our application we asked for and were awarded funds for the following:

Rental Assistance - \$1,200 Water Bills - \$300 Electric/Gas Bills - \$500
