The two "taboo" subjects – religion and politics – are easy to blame. We have likely heard many say, and have wondered ourselves, how Christians and churches are culpable in creating this chaos.

It is often said that religion and politics should not mix. It is true that there should be a separation of church and state and that churches should be non-partisan. Though politics is considered a dirty word, it is intended as the study and practice of ensuring the good of the polis – the community. Politics gets a bad reputation when politicians have selfish ambitions. Good politicians are humble and collaborate to improve the broader community, starting with those who need help most. God calls the Church to do the same.

Many people who claim to be "Bible believers" are now showing disdain for Jesus' commands to care for the poor, heal the sick, welcome the immigrants, and include the outcast. In contrast, to be a Christian means that we are speaking, acting, and serving with the love of Christ. To be a Bible believer means that we heed Micah 6:8 - "to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God."

As your pastor, I will continue to do my best to lead our church through a political landscape characterized by greed, chaos, and lies. Together, we will be a praying church where the living Word of God works through us to bring justice and peace to the polis, especially the powerless and overlooked.

#### Stewardship Ideas for February February 2025

Valentine's Day is just around the corner — a time to celebrate love. We often think of lines like "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways," or picture roses, cupids, and hearts filling store shelves. But amidst the romance, have we lost sight of love's deeper meaning?



Romantic love is everywhere, yet even that is often reduced to fleeting infatuation. More significantly, many have forgotten the love that Jesus calls us to live out: "Love your enemies" (Luke 6:27), "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:39), and "The one who loves another has fulfilled the law" (Romans 13:8).

This love isn't about warm, fuzzy feelings. Christian love is about action. It's choosing to act kindly, even when our feelings fall short. When someone cuts us off in traffic, we can respond with patience rather than anger. When dealing with a difficult coworker, we can show genuine interest in their life rather than just tolerating their presence.

Often, loving actions lead to loving feelings, not the other way around. Romantic love, for instance, grows deeper through small gestures like holding hands. Similarly, in other relationships, choosing to act with love can foster understanding and compassion over time.

This Valentine's Day, cherish romantic love but also take every opportunity to practice Christian love through your actions toward neighbors, enemies, and everyone you encounter. It's in these moments that we reflect God's greatest commandment: "Let all that you do be done in love" (1 Corinthians 16:14).

February Mission



The Hagar House is a Christ-centered home for single moms in the central Wisconsin area. They offer spiritual, emotional, physical, financial, relational, and life skills to these mothers to provide them the necessities to build a new home. In their latest Impact Snapshot, they reported 669 days of safety/shelter, 30,105 meals provided, \$20,630 in debt paid off by moms, 11 certifications and new jobs, and 2 vehicles gifted to moms. They also announced the construction of additional housing with attached garages (for safety) to be completed this year.

In 2024, we had another successful year of outreach through our Personal Needs and Claire's Critter Closets. The PNC served a total of 312 households representing 837 individuals. The CCC served a total of 210 households representing a total of 489 cats and dogs.

You can also donate physical items such as paper products, laundry soap, shampoo, body wash, and dog/cat food, treats, and toys. We will also take any non-hygiene items that may have been opened already such as laundry detergent or dry animal food. Thank you for your continued support of these valuable community missions!

#### **Roof Repair Campaign**

The trustees reviewed the roof construction project and removed sections that are not needed at this time including the Fellowship Hall. The construction has also been moved up to start in February/March 2025.

Our new total roof cost will be roughly \$188,000. A deposit of \$105,000 was made by reallocating some of the Pivet Scholarship Fund. Our congregation has raised \$41,551.32 and pledged an additional \$13,878.68. We also received a \$15,000 grant from the Conference thanks to the work of Bonnie and Margaret G.. This leaves a remaining balance of about \$12,500 (pending any additional construction costs). We will no longer need a loan for this expense thanks to the Pivet family and all other generous donors.

Please continue to donate for this important building expense. Memo your check or cash envelope, or donate online (*facilities project fund*).


